General information

Welcome Desks

The Main Welcome Desk at the Old Schools in the city centre (map location **A**) is open between 9.30am and 4.00pm each day. Staff are on hand to answer queries and you can pick up copies of various publications relating to the Open Days, undergraduate study at Cambridge, the University's Music Awards, student finance, and walking tour auides.

Disability Resource Centre (DRC)

The DRC provides information and support to prospective and current students with a disability/ specific learning difficulty/health condition.

Language Centre

Colleges

What's a College?

Cambridge is a 'collegiate' university. This means that it comprises various University faculties and departments in different academic subjects, and a number of Colleges.

Your College is your base for the time you're at Cambridge. It's where you live, eat, do a lot of socialising, receive academic and pastoral support, and where you often (though not always) have your supervisions. Students on the same course, regardless of their College, are taught together by the academic faculties/departments, attending the same lectures, seminars and practicals. There are no Colleges that are 'better' for certain subjects.

Advice on how (and how not) to choose a College, along with an explanation of the key functions that the University (through the faculties/departments) and Colleges are responsible for, can be found in the *Undergraduate Prospectus* and on our website (www.cam.ac.uk/choosingacollege/).

Visiting Colleges

The Colleges are open for visitors to drop in at the times specified below (please check the opening times carefully as access is not possible at any other time) – please follow the signs from the main College entrance (see the map on p12-3 for College locations).







Getting around Cambridge

The University faculties/departments and Colleges are located throughout the city, but Cambridge isn't a large city and is easy to get around. A map of the city centre can be found on p12-3 and a more detailed map of the University and Colleges is available from the Welcome Desks (map locations A S5 W1).

Most Open Days venues are within walking distance of the city centre, but some Colleges and departments are a little further out. If you have sufficient time you may like to walk out to these Colleges/departments. Alternatively, you may wish to use one of the bus services (see below).

Walking tours

Four walking tours are available – two around the city centre and two to/from West Cambridge. The tours vary in length (between 30 minutes and two hours) and you can pick these up from the Main Welcome Desk (map location **A**) and the West Cambridge Site Welcome Desk (map location **W1**).

If it's a nice day we particularly recommend the walk to West Cambridge (approximately 30 minutes each way), which takes you past the University Library and Faculty of Mathematics, as well as a number of the Colleges.

Buses

Cambridge Open Days shuttle bus

We are providing a free shuttle bus service between Queen's Road ('The Backs') and the West Cambridge Site (JJ Thomson Avenue). There is also a stop near Storey's Way, for those who wish to visit the Faculty of Mathematics and/or the Colleges in this area (Churchill, Fitzwilliam, Lucy Cavendish, St Edmund's and Murray Edwards).

The buses run between 9.30am and 4.45pm and we suggest you allow around 40 minutes for a journey. There is limited seating on each bus but we anticipate a pick-up/set down from each of the three stops every 10-20 minutes (traffic depending).

The last pick-up from Queen's Road (to West Cambridge) is at 4.00pm, and the last pick-up from the West Cambridge Site (to Queen's Road) is at 4.45pm. Please note that the West Cambridge Site is approximately 10 minutes' walk from the Madingley Road Park & Ride site.

City services

The Uni 4 and Citi 6 bus services (operated by Stagecoach, www.stagecoachbus.com) link the Colleges/departments with the city centre. Information and timetables are available from the Main Welcome Desk (map location A).

The train station is approximately 20 minutes' walk from the city centre, or buses depart every 10-20 minutes from Emmanuel Street.

If you use one of the Park & Ride services, you can catch a bus back from the following city centre bus stops to:

Travelling to Cambridge

Cambridge is a small and busy city, not built with modern traffic flows in mind, and so it's best to travel into the city by public transport.

By car


For those driving to Cambridge, the roads in and around the city centre can get congested and parking is very limited. Therefore, we recommend visitors arriving by car use the Park & Ride services into the city centre.

The Park & Ride sites are shown on the map (right). It is anticipated that the Park & Ride sites will be busy on 3 and 4 July (particularly Madingley Road and Trumpington). Therefore, allow plenty of time to travel in case your intended Park & Ride site is full and you have to continue to an alternative Park & Ride site.

Buses leave every 10 minutes and the journey normally takes around 15 minutes, but it's advised to allow at least 30 minutes to travel into the city centre. For more information, including timetables and ticket prices see the website at: www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/parkandride/.

Visitors from the north can also use the Guided Busway Park & Ride services into the city centre. Follow the signs for Longstanton Park & Ride from Junction 29 of the A14. For more information, including routes, timetables and ticket prices see the website at: www.thebusway.info.

By bus

National bus services stop on Parkside, Parker's Piece.

By train

Cambridge train station is approximately 20 minutes' walk from the city centre. There are bus stops in front of the main entrance and buses run every 10-20 minutes to St Andrew's Street in the city centre (returning to the station from Emmanuel Street).

For the Main Welcome Desk (A), city centre sites (D F M) and city centre Colleges, use one of the Citi services to St Andrew's Street.

Between 8.00am and 11.00am only on 3 and 4 July the Uni 4 bus service is stopping at the train station before continuing on to West Road (for the Sidgwick Site **S**) and then to the West Cambridge Site (**W** alight at Conduit Head Road stop). Visitors wishing to return to the station on the Uni 4 service need to alight on Brooklands Avenue and walk from there to the station (via Brookgate).
